



THE DEATH OF H.M. QUEEN ELIZABETH.

Northwich Town Council worked alongside many partners throughout this sad time including Cheshire West & Chester Council, BRIO Leisure Centre and Northwich BID who all worked exceptionally hard under difficult circumstances.



REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY 13TH NOVEMBER

The annual Remembrance Sunday will take place with a parade starting from Victoria Street car park, adjacent to the Police Station at 9.45 a.m. and will make it's way to St Helen's Church for a Remembrance Service at 10 a.m. This will be followed by the Act of Remembrance at the Cenotaph on Church Road where a minutes silence will be observed at 11.00 a.m. in memory of all who have died in various conflicts. Poppy wreaths will be laid on the Cenotaph by dignitaries, individuals and local communities. The Parade will then reform and gather at Memorial Court where the Town Mayor will take the salute.
