"It's been another incredible year for Northwich."

The Town Council officers and staff, alongside our dedicated partners, have worked tirelessly to deliver an outstanding calendar of events and meaningful community improvements.

Through strong partnerships with Northwich BID, Rotary, Barons Quay, Cheshire West & Chester Council, and many other local organisations, we've been able to combine resources and budgets to bring a variety of vibrant events to the town. These have included the NOW Festival, Piña Colada Festival, River Festival, multiple music festivals, and of course, our much-loved Christmas Extravaganza.

Very few towns in Cheshire can boast such a packed events programme. It's this spirit of collaboration that enables us to continue delivering high-quality experiences for our businesses, residents, and visitors.

Community Improvements

This year, we've also made significant strides in improving community spaces:

Belmont Road Play Area has undergone a complete £200k refurbishment, funded through Section 106 agreements, Members' Budgets, the FCC Communities Grant, and Rudheath & Witton Together. The play area is now fully accessible, shaped by feedback from local user groups, and has received glowing praise since reopening.

Our allotment sites have seen upgrades including new car parks, fencing, and gates—enhancements warmly welcomed by our plot holders.

In partnership with Northwich BID, our floral displays remain among the best in the borough. Huge thanks go to our dedicated parks team for their continued efforts in keeping Northwich beautiful.

Additional improvements across the town include the installation of wildflower meadows, upgrades to cemeteries, new CCTV, and public benches in various locations.

Public Safety Initiatives

We now have 26 accessible AEDs (Automated External Defibrillators) installed throughout the town centre. This year, we've also introduced blood loss control kits in five of these cabinets, all registered with the NHS—further enhancing public safety.

Looking Ahead

We understand that towns across the country are facing challenges. However, Northwich stands out because of the united effort from partners and the community. By continuing to stage events, maintain high standards in cleanliness and appearance, and enhance our public spaces, we're building a town that attracts new businesses, welcomes visitors, and inspires people to live and work here.

Thank you for supporting our work, attending our events, and taking part in consultations. Together, we are making Northwich a wonderful place to be.

EVENTS AND INITIATIVES



Church Walk Paddling Pool

Another successful year was had for families enjoying the free facility at Church Walk Paddling pool. Many people also took advantage of the private hire option available including Tiny Steps, who held weekly sessions for children with additional needs.

Vickersway Park

Vickersway Park is enjoyed by adults and children alike throughout the year. During the summer months, many families came down to make the most of the mini golf, tennis courts and play area before indulging in an ice cream and coffee. Improvements were made to the Crazy Golf fencing and old wooden sleepers were removed and replaced with recycled plastic.





AED Install

This year we were able to install 2 additional defibs into Northwich funded by Northwich Rotary, Northwich BID and members budget from Sam Naylor, Arthur Neil and Felicity Davies. These are located at Northwich Methodist Outreach Centre on Witton Street and Northwest Performance on Navigation Road and take the total amount of defibs in Northwich to 26. We also installed 5 blood loss kits throughout the town centre which are also installed within the AED Cabinet.



Allotments

Thanks to Section 106 funding we were able to carry out much needed works on Queensgate, Vickersway and Winnington Allotments.

Winnington Allotments works included:

- Brand new 6ft high security fencing and double gates
- New tap
- Clearance of brash pile – creating a new allotment plot

Queensgate Allotments works included:

- Car park retarmacked

Vickersway Allotments works included:

- Car parked retarmacked
- New fencing between Vickersway Park and the Allotments





Verdin Park Woodland Walk

Thanks to CWAC volunteers, the woodland walk through Verdin Park was given a significant upgrade, brand new edging boards were installed the entire way along the path and the path was extended to meet the road through Verdin. This was then filled with wood chips and finally, 2 benches were installed, allowing people the opportunity to sit and appreciate the wildlife.





Dane Valley

Dane Valley Cemetery is a beautiful tranquil area that is maintained to a high standard by our own staff, this year has seen additional plinths installed for full burial and cremations along with a new tap.

We have also installed some additional drainage to enable the cemetery to be accessed even through the wet Winter months.



Dane Valley Children's Section

An area in the Cemetery at Dane Valley has been set aside for Children's Cremations, plinths have been laid for headstones, this is in a very peaceful section of the Cemetery.



Remembrance Sunday

The Remembrance Parade and Service is always well attended by residents and local organisations coming together to pay their respects. This year was no different and on Sunday 10th November many gathered at Crum Hill to take part in the parade, marching to St Helen's Church before attending the service at the Cenotaph.



Christmas Extravaganza

Once again, Northwich Christmas Extravaganza was one of the highlights of the year, attracting many visitors to the town. Taking place on Saturday 23rd November, many familiar attractions returned for another year including fairground rides, Christmas themed games, hot food, games and a special guest visiting from the North Pole.

The lantern parade, headed by the Bataala Mersey Samba Band, included children from local schools, the snow queen sculpture and the cast of the Christmas Pantomime at Brio Leisure Centre. The finale of the event was a spectacular fireworks display and ultimately, the turning on of the Christmas lights throughout the town.





Ice Rink

The ice rink returned to Northwich on the weekend of the 30th November to extend the festive fun following the Extravaganza.

The rink provided multiple sessions and ensured that whether visitors were novice to skating or a seasoned pro they could all enjoy the thrill of skating.



Tree of Lights

Our annual Tree of Lights Ceremony held in December is always well attended, with this year being no different.

Celebrating a life at Christmas appeals to so many who have lost a loved one and the simple, quiet service draws people in, providing them a safe space to remember those they have lost. The holly tree is adorned with stars dedicated to those past, with readings from Rev. Andrew Ridley, Father Paul and our Town Mayor, the Tree of Lights Ceremony touches the hearts of many.

Belmont Road Play Area

Northwich Town Council took over the management of Belmont Road Play Area from Cheshire West and Chester a number of years ago, and since then it has been in need of improvements. The play area has now been completely revamped, the old tired equipment has been removed and replaced with new exciting equipment and was ready just in time for the Easter half term (2025). Local residents with children with additional needs were involved in the design process, meaning that much of the equipment is accessible, allowing as many children as possible to enjoy the site.





Cenotaph

Following the improvements made to the Cenotaph located on Church Road, this year has seen further works carried out. A pillar was reset and the paving was re-grouted as this had begun to fail. This work and care will ensure that the site is ready for Remembrance services and simple daily acts of Remembrance for those who wish to attend.



Easter Egg Hunt

The Easter Egg Hunt, held in Vickersway Park on Easter Sunday, was well attended, the BBQ keeping people fed with burgers and hot dogs whilst children ran excitedly throughout the park trying to locate the hidden word and win an Easter Egg.

Northwich Lions Walk

There was also a gentle 30 minute walk with our Town Mayor on the Easter Sunday that left Northwich Memorial Court at 11.15am finishing in Vickersway Park for the Easter Egg Event.
