Project Description:

Changing Lives Together are a Cheshire based charity, focused on making a difference in the lives of local people and having an impact on the wider environment.

We deliver innovative solutions for environmental and social challenges that improve the lives of local people, their environment and their wellbeing.

The focus of our application is our Buddy & Befriending Scheme (B&B). As we know, loneliness is a silent killer and our B&B project is an impactful intervention, ensuring that the loneliest people in our community speak to someone at least once a week. Our support is for those aged over 18 but we mainly support those aged 60 + with the majority of our clients being 65 years and over.

Our telephone befriending service is a vital lifeline for people in Northwich. It offers companionship and emotional support that lifts mood, improves mental health, and strengthens overall wellbeing. For those who are housebound, these regular calls provide more than just conversation, they create a powerful connection to the outside world and a genuine sense of care. We have had 158 referrals for our service for the Northwich area, so far this year and we are currently supporting 102 clients with calls from our amazing volunteers.

Building on the success of this service, we expanded our offering with group sessions. These groups serve as a natural extension of our phone calls, providing a safe, welcoming, and non-judgemental space for those ready to take the next step towards in-person interaction. Helping individuals feel a sense of community and belonging.

At our Warm Welcome group held at Rudheath Social Club we have 35 clients enlisted, with an average of 25 -30 people attending each week. The group is very popular and we also currently have a waiting list in place.

At our group, our lovely clients enjoy a delicious two-course hot meal along with refreshments, a variety of engaging activities such as music, quizzes, bingo, and games, as well as informative talks on topics relevant to their needs. These sessions are designed to offer both enjoyment and practical support, helping to enrich lives and promote wellbeing.

How will the local community benefit?

Reduced loneliness and isolation: Local residents who are vulnerable or socially disconnected will receive regular support, helping them feel less alone and more included in their community.

Improved mental health and wellbeing: Consistent emotional support can reduce anxiety, depression, and stress, leading to better health outcomes and a higher quality of life.

Stronger community connections: By linking individuals in groups and services, the project fosters lasting relationships, encourages social participation, and builds a more resilient, interconnected community.

Empowered volunteers: Local people who give their time, benefit from meaningful roles, new skills, increased confidence, and a stronger sense of purpose.

Reduced pressure on health and social care services: Early intervention through social contact helps prevent more serious health issues, easing demand on GPs, hospitals, and social care providers.

In short, this project helps to create a kinder, more supportive community where everyone has the opportunity to feel heard, connected, and cared for.

Our project is one of a kind and brings so much to so many lonely and isolated people, so much so that our aim is to grow the service to offer more WWG's and be that everlasting change in someone's life.

Throughout the life of this project, we've worked hard to ensure that B&B is not something done to the community, nor simply in the community, it is something done with the community.

With your funding we can support our Warm Welcome Group for a minimum of 8 weeks as calculated above. If we receive any food donations during this time, the funds will be extended to enable the group to continue for additional weeks.

<i>Please set out what your project aims and objectives are as clearly as possible – you may continue on a separate sheet if necessary</i> For the last four years I have been running a men's charity 7-a-side football tournament, fundraising for Prostate Cancer UK, with every penny raised going to the charity. This started when a local referee was diagnosed with the condition. Last year, with the support of the Town Council and the new pitches at Moss Farm we brought the tournament to my hometown of Northwich. I am writing to ask if I could secure a grant to cover the cost of this £375 hire or a contribution towards it. Even a small amount would make a massive difference. I notice that you say you don't usually cover venue costs with grants, but I believe the terms of this are slightly different. If this is a sticking point, then we also require funds to purchase things like footballs for the day, trophies, referee fees etc. If this is possible, we would also like the council to consider being involved in naming one of the trophy or cups we present on the day e.g. The John Smith Memorial Cup. Perhaps someone local that has sadly lost their life to cancer or a notable sporting character the has passed away? I would be great if we could get a member of their family to come and present the award as well. As well as raising money for a great cause, the day is of great social and health benefit to those residents taking part and continues to go from strength to strength. Through hard work it is becoming one of the talking points of the local sporting calendar. There are loads of tournaments focused on children but nothing for the older generations (open age). I believe this is something that is unique in the Northwest and can be another event to help put Northwich on the sporting map. In time I would also like to grow this to include a women's competition as well. We are the parent body for schools' football in Cheshire with responsibility for football in primary schools, secondary schools and colleges. Our objective is to promote the mental, moral and physical development of schoolboys/girls through the medium of association football. We organise 19 competitions for schools and district teams within Cheshire involving hundreds of boys and girls from the age of 9 up to 18. This season, around 400 youngsters from Northwich schools will be competing in a variety of competitions with four secondary schools entering a total of 25 teams in county cup competitions and many Northwich primary schools competing in district tournaments to represent the district in the county primary schools' finals held at Crewe in January. In May 2026 we shall be staging a two-day festival of football for boys and girls on the SEND register of their school. This has attracted entries from all four secondary schools in Northwich. About 40 Northwich children who do not normally play organised football will have the opportunity to represent their school in a structured tournament. We also run five county teams (U14 & U16 Girls; U14, U16, U18 Boys) with Northwich schools well represented in the squads.

We are asking whether Northwich Town Council could support our association's programme of football for 2025-26 to enable us to provide the opportunities we currently offer for the county's (and Northwich's) youngsters. Northwich lies at the heart of our county and the facilities in the town play a key part in many of our activities eg Rudheath Senior Academy stages our U12 5-a-side tournaments and our SEND Festival of Football takes place at Moss Farm. We would welcome any assistance eg £100 would provide 2-3 match balls for our finals, £200 would support one of our girls' cup competitions and £300 would go a long way towards meeting the costs of our Football Festival at Moss Farm. We would ensure that the support of Northwich Town Council was acknowledged in our programmes and on our website.

We have been very grateful for the support afforded by the council in recent years. We do hope that our application for a grant this season will be favourably received. Any help would be greatly appreciated!

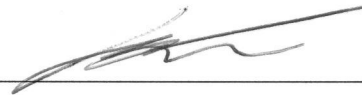

Northwich Pride CIO is a registered charity (no. 1215314). Building on the success of our indoor event in late 2024, and work to build up a community and body of volunteers during 2025, we are seeking to hold our first community-led outdoor Pride event on **6 June 2026, running 11am - 4:30pm**. The date has been chosen as it is towards the start of the Pride season, without clashing with other Prides in Cheshire.

Following the advice of the other Prides operating across Cheshire, with whom we meet bi-monthly, we have chosen a small reasonably constrained location for our event, and are cognisant of where we can make savings if the full funding we are seeking from NTC, Cheshire West Crowd's Community Innovation Fund and other sponsors and supporters is not achieved. For our 2026 event, we have selected **Grozone Community Garden** as the location. The venue has community at its very heart, is readily accessible from the town centre, and offers a constrained, fenced site. We would have the site be traffic free during the event, but ensure that the roadway on the site remained clear of any structures that could hinder emergency access if required. As there is only one toilet (which is disabled access) on the site, though there are additional facilities over in Vickersway Park, we would be hiring in some portaloos to minimise our impact on the park.

To support the costs of the event, we would be inviting food and drink vendors from Northwich to pay for a stall, though we would only have a limited number of such stalls due to the space we have available. We have previously been in communication with Northwich Park Run organisers, such that they have previously offered to do a "rainbow" park run on the date, just as they do a special park run for the Pina Colada festival.

In addition to making sure we have all the insurances and licences in place (both ours and that of our suppliers), we will be having security and first aiders on site.

Consistent with our governing document, the event will help us to promote equality and diversity, advance education and eliminate discrimination in relation to lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans and non-binary (LGBTQIA+) people, in particular but not exclusively, in Northwich and the surrounding villages for the public benefit by:

- **Education:** Stalls with relevant support organisations, charities and community groups of relevance to the LGBTQIA+ community, but accessible to all of the Northwich community.
[We are in communication with other like-minded organisations operating in Northwich and Cheshire, allowing a cross-fertilisation of ideas and ways of supporting each other. These include, but are not limited to: Radiate Arts CIC, West Cheshire Museums, Open Space (a Mid-Cheshire Methodist church project), Body Positive and Silver Rainbows, CWAC Youth Service, MyCWA, Queerly Beloved Book Club, the Rotary Club and Northwich Community Partnerships.]
- **Celebration:** A stage with musical and drag performances from local artists and community groups. Activities running at various points throughout the day in specific locations on the site beyond that of the stalls and stage, including meditation, mindful movement, circus skills, crafts with recycled materials, making bath bombs, making seed bombs.
[These activities have been picked to try to promote well-being and to be of interest to a range of age groups.]
- **Inclusion:** The majority of the site is wheelchair accessible, with the volunteers at Grozone regularly repairing any weather related damage to the walkways. We would use the pre-existing yurt as a safe space for people to go to if they are over stimulated or just need a break. If finances allow, we would seek to have a BSL interpreter for some or all of the event.
[We have seen sanctuary spaces used to good effect at other Pride events.]

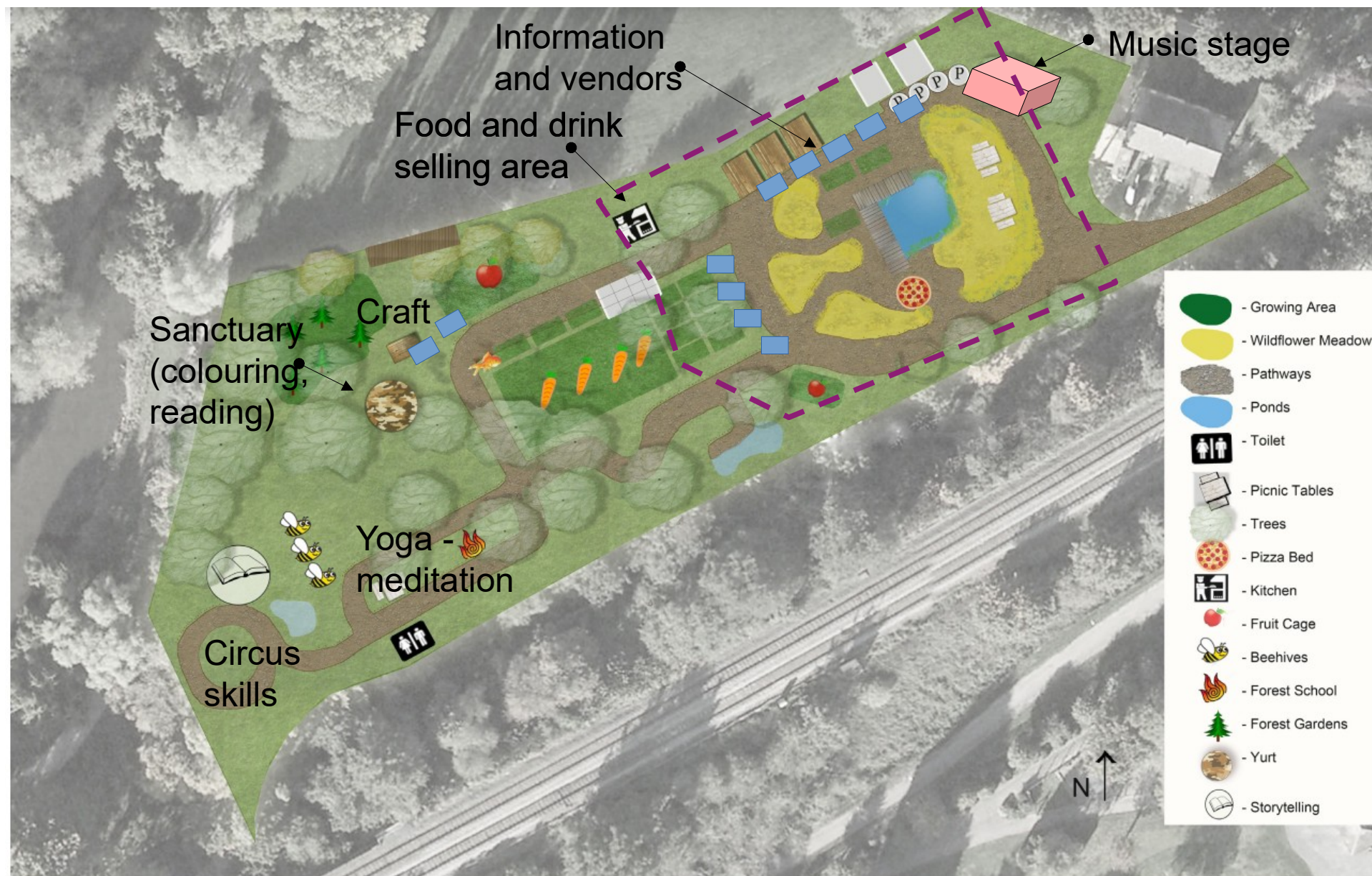

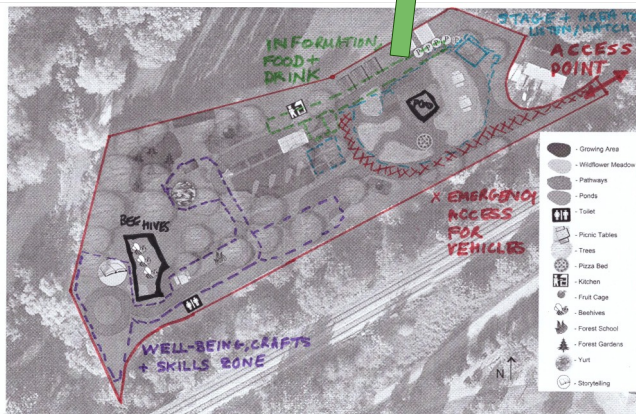

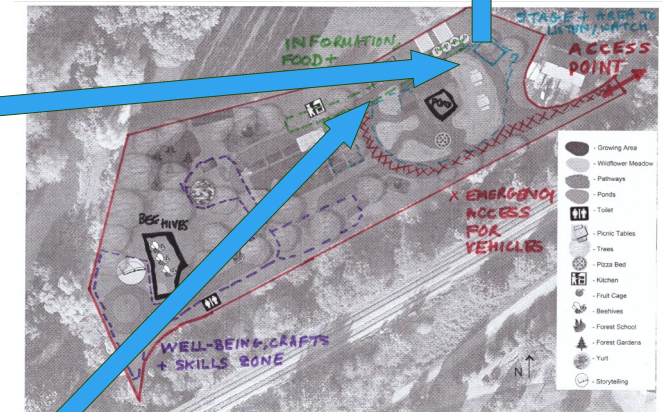

There are organically formed spaces in the landscaping for people to enjoy event, sitting on the ground or chairs.

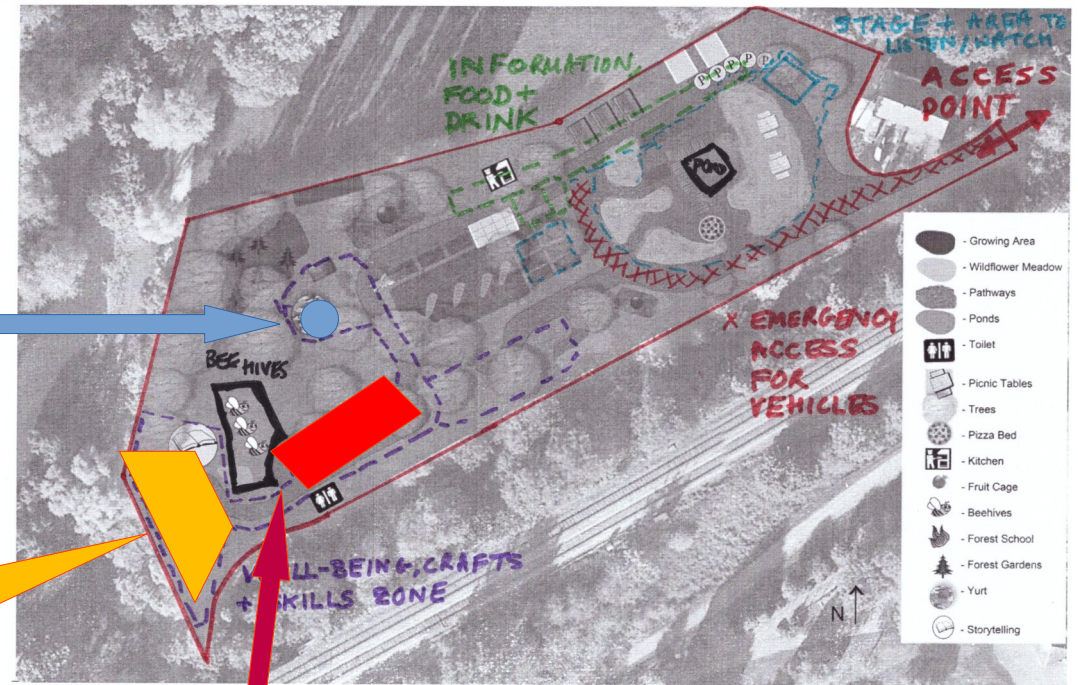
